The **Ex Libris Association** (ELA) offers an Indigenous Student Bursary of \$2,500 to an Indigenous student in a first or second year of library or archival studies – at the masters or technician level. Education students pursuing teacher librarian certification are also eligible.

ELA's goal in offering the bursary is to encourage more Indigenous voices among staff in all types of libraries. ELA is partnered with **Indspire** which manages the bursary.
